TEACHING PHILOSOFIE or PROGRAMME OUTLINE

Department of glass art as a permanent structural unit was set up in 1994, but the first glass artists have been trained at the Academy since the 1960s. The training provides an opportunity to understand the materials used in glass art, and promotes the creative and research skills of students. Study programme introduces students to the various types of glass, starting from stained glass up to mosaic and 3D glass objects, as well as different techniques: fusing, casting, pate de verre technique, glass painting, coldworking and glass blowing in studios. As there are no thematic limits, in Master's programme students can pursue their interests and are encouraged to experiment with materials and techniques. Summer practice provides important role to studies of nature – plain air drawing and painting, as well as management of glass art exhibitions and processes of restoration.

The Department of Glass Art participates in ERASMUS + exchange programme and in other educational and creative activities.
